



Voter Registration for Town Election/Town Meeting/Supervisors of The Checklist Session—You may register to vote with the Strafford Town Clerk during regular business hours on or before Thursday, March 1; you may register to vote at the Supervisors of the Checklist session on Saturday, March 3, from 11:00 to 11:30 am at the Strafford Town Hall (change of party will be accepted). March 3 will be the last date to register to vote at the School District Meeting on March 10. If you wish to vote at Town Election or Town Meeting, you may register at Town Election on March 13. Please note that if you have not registered to vote by March 13, you will not be eligible to vote at Town Meeting on Saturday, March 17. STRAFFORD TOWN REPUBLICANS

Representative Kurt Wuelper and Senator John Reagan joined us for the monthly round table. We discussed the New Hampshire House Calendar which comes out every week being a very useful tool for state representatives and something that citizens would find quite informative too. We also learned that the first few days run through bills from last year. The House passed a further loosening of marijuana regulations and passed a family leave bill that is an opt-out option and is likely to falter in the Finance Committee as being non-financially sound. The School Budget Hearing was January 24, 2018 at 6:00 in the cafeteria, and the School District Meeting is March 10, 2018. Strafford voters will be voting for three School Board seats this year. We also learned that the adoption of newer versions of building and fire codes were again voted down due to the increased costs of construction they would have entailed. Another bill afoot seeks to even out revenues for roads and bridges that normally come from gas taxes for those driving electric and hybrid cars. The simplest proposal for this is a 200 dollar annual fee for electric cars and 100 dollars for hybrids. Please join us on second Tuesdays from 6:30 to 8:00 pm at Hill Library in Strafford. STRAFFORD TOWN DEMOCRATS

The Town Democratic Committee will meet on Tuesday, February 6, at 7 pm at Hill Library. Looking ahead to the midterm elections, one of our focuses in the coming months will be to give Strafford residents opportunities to meet candidates running in our district. Democratic candidate for Congress Terence O'Rourke will speak at our meeting on March 6. Congressional candidate Mindi Messmer will speak at our April 3 meeting.

To address vulnerabilities in the State's election systems, the committee last fall unanimously approved a resolution emphasizing that voting in New Hampshire is a fundamental right. The action supported passage of LSR #18-2327.0, and the resulting house bill, which authorizes a moderator to conduct a verification count of machine-counted ballots. The law is needed because of the steady increase in the theft of personal, commercial, industrial, and government information by domestic and foreign actors, according to Committee Chair Bob Perry. Verification procedures are intended to help counter vulnerabilities in existing electronic ballot-counting devices used throughout New Hampshire. "We want to ensure that every vote counts and every vote is counted," said Perry. HB-372, an attempt to make voting difficult for certain segments of our population, including students, was recently passed by the Legislature and is headed for the Governor's desk. 




CONSERVATION NOTES

A great way to protect your land is through the creation of a conservation easement. A conservation easement is a legally binding agreement between a landowner and a public agency or qualified non-profit organization that restricts use of the land to protect its significant natural features. The landowner agrees to conserve the land and its resources while yielding rights to exercise more intensive uses like residential development or mining, excavating, or dumping of hazardous materials. Your land will be managed for multiple conservation benefits such as wildlife habitat, watershed protection, agricultural or timber protection, recreation and scenic preservation.

The holder of the easement monitors land use to ensure the terms of the easement are upheld. The landowner is free to live on and manage the land, sell it or pass it on to heirs. The easement remains forever. There are potential financial benefits related to tax considerations. Some public agencies holding conservation easements are Town Conservation Commissions and Fish and Game. Non-profit organizations include Nature Conservancy, NH Forest Society, and Bear-Paw. DO YOU KNOW WHERE YOUR TRASH IS?


